

	5 May 51		<p>Brigade conference held at 1100 hours today. Most of those not on duty or fatigues went on pass to Tacoma and vicinity for a last visit. Weather - Sunny and Warm.</p>	
	6 May 51		<p>Lines were quiet with most personnel packing personal gear. Weather - Sunny and Warm.</p>	
	7 May 51		<p>The main part of the day was spent in packing stores and personal gear by the main party. All Orderly rooms except that of HQ where Capt R.J. Kerfoot OC rear party has his Headquarters were dismantled and packed for shipping. Battalion fell in on parade square in full marching order and were assigned to their cars. Battalion embusses and were taken to North Fort Lewis Railhead. Troops entrained. Trains left North Fort Lewis for Wainwright Military Camp in Alberta. ON BOARD TROOP TRAIN	8 May 51		<p>Troops were quiet and well behaved on train through the day. No alcoholic beverages were in evidence. During the day troops detrained at Boston Bar and Kamloops Junction for exercise.</p> <p>CA (SF) patches which were worn by all ranks were taken down today except by those who are warned for draft or who have returned from Korea. Patches have been redesignated for 25 CIB.</p> <p>Weather - Cloudy and cool with some showers. Mist was low in the mountains and visibility was poor.</p>	
ON BOARD TROOP TRAIN	9 May 51		<p>Good behavior prevailed throughout the remainder of the trip. Troops detrained at Edmonton for a rest and were served coffee and donuts by the Salvation Army.</p> <p>1430 Trains arrived at Wainwright Military Camp. Troops detrained and formed up alongside their respective cars.</p> <p>1500 Troops marched into camp and were assigned to their quarters.</p> <p>1600 QM parade was held and sheets blankets and mattress covers were issued.</p> <p>Weather - Sunny and very warm.</p>	
WAINWRIGHT	10 May		<p>The job of settling in the huts has begun. All orderly rooms except that of D Company and HQ company are located in the same building. Stores were unloaded there. The battalion is sleeping in double tier bunks in "H" type huts. There are approximately 48 men to one side of a hut.</p> <p>The huts are clean and newly painted. The camp itself is in a state of preparation with numerous additions planned for construction. Bulldozers and graders are much in evidence.</p> <p>Weather - Sunny and very warm.</p>	
	11 May		<p>Brigadier's conference was held in the morning. Training dress and discipline were discussed. The settling in process is continuing. One big complaint with the camp is the ever present quantities of sand and dust. When there is a wind blowing clouds of dust are raised which are quite disconcerting.</p> <p>Weather - Cloudy and much cooler. The days are usually warm but it cools off rapidly in the evening.</p>

WAINWRIGHT	12 May		<p>Draft for Korea was warned in the morning. Personnel on draft were granted 14 days leave and three days was embarkation leave. Preparation of forms and documents took most of the morning. Personnel were paid and given any lacking inoculations. They then proceeded on leave as soon as transportation was available.</p> <p>Weather - Cloudy in the morning but sun came out in afternoon.</p>	<p>Appendix </p>
	13 May		<p>Lines were quiet.</p> <p>Remainder of draft left on leave.</p> <p>Weather - Cloudy with rain.</p>	
	14 May		<p>Company lines were quiet with fatigues being carried out. Canteens have been set up by Brigade. There are both wet and dry canteens.</p> <p>One WOII, one S/Sgt, 3 Sergeants and seven Corporals to go to Calgary.</p> <p>The tenting areas are being prepared by civilian contractors. It is expected that troops will move into tents on or about 15 Jun 51.</p> <p>Major George returned from Korea on rotation and assumed command of "A" Coy.</p> <p>Weather - Sunny and warm.</p>	
	15 May		<p>The Junior NCO school was organized and will get under way tomorrow.</p> <p>The "I" Corporal, Major Macneill and Capt Isenor made a recon of the training areas. They found several excellent training areas but found mosquitoes too numerous for comfort.</p> <p>Weather - Warm and sunny.</p>	
	16 May		<p>Word was received from brigade that the sailing times for the draft to Korea had been delayed so wires were sent to all personnel on draft granting them a five day extension.</p> <p>Brigadier McGill held and "O" Group with sports under discussion.</p> <p>Jr. NCO school commenced at 0800 Hrs.</p> <p>Those that could be spared from HQ Company spent the day on the ranges.</p> <p>The duty of orderly officer is discontinued. The battalion is too short of officers and as a Garrison Orderly Officers is being appointed there will be no need for one.</p> <p>Weather - Warm and Sunny.</p>


