Beauchamp took a patrol of 33 men on a security patrol in the back of the battalion area to hill 832.</p> <p>The patrol picked up five men in civilian clothing, two of which were turned over to 7 RCT of 1 Cav Div by patrol. The remaining three were brought back to Tac HQ where they were transported to Field Security Section at 25 CIB.</p> <p>On this date at 1900 hrs the CO, Major H.D.P. Tighe MC, held an "O" group and gave out plans for a patrol for the following day, July 2. Patrol to go to code sign RECESS at hill 501 MR 342428 (see map of Chorwon area in appendices).</p> <p>Today the compromise of all the map code words necessitates changing of all the code words on the battle maps due to the loss of a map board in presumed enemy territory.</p> <p>The weather continues very hot and dry, the temperature in the 90's, making it very hard on the men patrolling.</p> <p>Nightly ration of beer, one bottle per man and a chance to go for a swim in the reservoir near Tac HQ somewhat compensates for the heat and keeps the morale of the men quite high.</p>	1-9  59  <i>HAT</i>

CHORWON	July 2 1951		<p>Baker and Dog Coy's are to patrol to code sign RECESS. In support are two MMG sections, 81 MM Mortar and two troops of artillery. For information concerning this patrol see intelligence log July 2 in appendices.</p> <p>This morning the 2nd battalion RGR had a three man patrol ambushed and killed at MR 386362 (Chorwon sheet). The three bodies were still warm when found by Lt. McDonald of the Engineers at 0845 hrs this morning, on his way out to sweep the roads and tracks over which the patrol is to travel.</p> <p>General concensus of opinion is that the three men were ambushed by North Korean civilians and Brigadier J.M. Rockingham DSO, MC, has laid on vigorous security patrols for following day to clear all civilians from the area.</p>	<p>10 - 14 61 <i>HST</i></p>
CHORWON	July 3 1951		<p>Brigadier J.M. Rockingham DSO, MC, brought the divisional commander Major General A.J.H. Cassells CB, CBE, DSO, who is to be Commander of the First Commonwealth Division, around to our battalion at approximately 1330 hrs this date and the CO Major H.D.P. Tighe MC, escorted them around the Coy and Battalion positions. Upon returning from the Coy positions, after a hot climb, the visiting General, his aide de camp, and Brigadier Rockingham went for a swim in the reservoir at Tac HQ. This swimming pool is becoming quite popular throughout the whole Brigade.</p> <p>No large scale Coy patrols was laid on for this date, but C Coy sent out a small patrol of two section strength to the battalions immediate front for a distance of from four to five thousand yards. CHORWON	July 4 1951		<p>A typical hot day turning cloudy with light rain in the evening.</p> <p>This was a quiet day throughout the battalion, with nothing of notable importance happening throughout the day. It is noted however, that in spite of the combined efforts of all the Field Security Units to clear civilians from our battalion and patrol areas, it has proved almost a hopeless task. For as a village is cleared out one day, upon returning the following day almost as many new civilians have moved into the area. This is also evident through our patrols. Nearly every time a patrol goes out they run into civilians, many of whom are of military age and although most of these are diseased or starving, considering the number of enemy agents known to be working in the area it creates quite a problem.</p> <p>At present attached to this unit to cope with the civilian situation, are four men from the Brigade Field Security Section consisting of one Staff Sgt, two Sgts and one Korean interpreter. Coy's allow a section at a time to come down to Tac HQ to swim and wash clothes in reservoir.</p>	18  NAT

The friendly strength was four men who managed to fight off the thirty man enemy ambush. These people were principally dressed in civilian clothes with four only dressed in uniform. Casualties inflicted on enemy were four dead and the remainder dispersed. H. Wray was sent out in front of the battalion area and returned without incident.</p> <p>To-day it was announced that as NCO vacancies occurred in the battalion the policy would be to draw fifty per cent from the battalion itself and fifty per cent from reinforcements in Japan.</p>	<p>20</p> <p><i>HST</i></p>

CHORWON	July 9		To-day C Coy sent out a platoon screening patrol across the front of the battalion area towards the 7 RCT 1 Cav Div boundary. They encountered nothing and returned without incident. The F.S. people are still collecting civilians across the battalion front this date.  The 2 I/C and two O R's from the 2nd battalion R22R were killed by an enemy mine while crossing the ford at approximate area grid square 4038, Chorwon sheet 6628 IV. It is believed the mine used had been laid for tanks as it was very powerful and completely demolished heavy scout car.	24  61  HST
CHORWON	July 10		B Coy sent out a platoon sized patrol. Patrol moved out the regular route to base of hill 501 at MR 342428. This route not according to Brigade trace. Upon arrival they received several rounds of enemy mortar fire. They were then ordered to withdraw as patrol was only of reconnaissance.  The news this evening told that the negotiating parties started their talks at 1100 hrs to-day at the city of KAESONG. Part of their statement read that fighting would continue until an armistice had been signed, except in the immediate vicinity of KAESONG itself. CHORWON	July 11		<p>Lt. Argent ex I O 3 BAR paid a social visit to our HQ to-day, to bid farewell on eve of his departure to Australia.</p> <p>At 0900 hrs this date Lt. Reid of five platoon B Coy and Coy Commander plus one MMG, Mortars and CO Tac HQ went on patrol to village code name APRIL, SANGGADAN-GOL Chorwon sheet MR 536416. The patrol came under enemy small arms fire and A.W. fire at approximately 1210 hrs from MR 361408 and MR 345412. Patrol was ambushed at this point receiving two dead and one wounded in initial fire. Three others were wounded while attempting to withdraw. Fire came from an unestimated number of enemy. CHORWON	July 12		<p>One platoon of B Coy went out to defend Arty O P at MR 367387. The Arty was in support of RGR patrol. The weather was slightly cloudy with light sun showers.</p> <p>Another group of 75 men left on five day R &amp; R leave to Commonwealth Leave Centre Ebisu Leave Camp, Japan. The trip entailed a two hour trip from the F echelon to B echelon where troops are paid, a three hour truck trip from B echelon to FMA in Seoul, a one hour trip from FMA camp to Kimpo Airport, and 4½ hours by plane from Kimpo to Tachikawa Airport, Tokyo. On arrival at Ebisu all ranks received complete decontamination shower and change of clothes; this is compulsory. A complete medical before leaving, the main purpose of which was to ensure that all ranks had completed all necessary inoculations. This leaves approximately 100 men of original battalion strength yet to go on R &amp; R.</p>	27  HST

CHORWON	July 13		<p>Weather very hot and dry. A patrol of two Coy strength going out to-day. B Coy under command Major V. Lilley MC, C Coy under command Major D.R. Harrison with troop of tanks from Ld. S. H., one battery of Arty, two sections 81 MM Mortar, flame throwers, detachment Engineers, one section MM. This patrol to advance to code sign APRIL MR 256414 Chorwon sheet, where the enemy were contacted on July 11. The patrol is to pick up the two X Ray casualties from previous engagement and to ascertain if the enemy is still in the area. The X Ray casualties were recovered, no enemy contact was made but Air OP reported groups of enemy at MR 255435 Chorwon sheet. Artillery fire was placed on them under direction of spotter plane. Artillery and Mortar fire was also placed on hills at MR 363410 to cover fording of river. Patrol continued to code sign APRIL under cover of smoke screen supported by tanks and flame throwers. Tanks fired on movement in village but no return fire was received and the patrol returned without incident.</p> <p>Tac HQ with CO, artillery FOO, Mortars, and LO from tanks was set up at MR 370390. Additional men were carried as part of Tac HQ for defence and to cover withdrawal of B Coy across river if necessary. C Coy was employed in covering the left flank along ridge from MR 360399 to MR 312370. Brigadier Rockingham was near battalion Tac HQ most of the day directing operations of PPCLI and RCR's. For detailed account see Int Log July 13.</p> <p>According to radio reports peace talks at KAESONG are bogged down because of heavy restrictions imposed upon EUSAK representatives by Chinese. The theatre was dedicated to 1st Lt. HAGER 7 Cav Rgt who was killed in action June 3, 1951, near the spot where the show was held. Henry DFC, 2 PPCLI, was presented with a watch by Brigadier Rockingham for receiving top honors in the school.</p> <p>A second group of a similar amount left the battalion area at 1700 hrs to see the Jack Benny Show.</p> <p>The battalion's activities for the day consisted of a patrol of one platoon from B Coy which was commanded by Lt. D.M. Langley and Coy Commander Major V. Lilley MC. The patrol proceeded to pass at MR 373370. The two snipers attached to patrol were to proceed to code name ARROW, they saw movement on hill at MR 365386 and returned. 
