Engineers and Bn Pioneers prepared a roadway into new Tac positions from old existing tracks. These roads are cut and gauged along the side of hills by bulldeers and graders and an attempt made to keep above the innumerable wet paddy fields.  At 1630 hours the CO met the Brigadier and CO of the Van Dees on codesigne "C" MR 208159 for the purpose of tying in battalion beundaries.  The Rice Burners worked until late evening carrying barbed wire, pickets, and "C" Rations up to rifle company positions.  When this Battalion is committed to battle the following has been the usual breakdown.  1. Battalion Tac. Censisting of the CO, Battle Adjutant (who is OC of Support Coy), IO, and "I" Section, Signals Officer, and Signals Plateen, MO with his RAP, and an Artillery Liason Officer.  2. Rifle Companies. OC Company, possibly a Tank L.O., 4.2 Mortar FOO, Artillery FOO, and three rifle platoons. When possible a field kitchen.  3. "F" Echelon. Sited near Bn Tac and administered usually by the Bn MMG efficer. Here is stationed Support Coy, second line of amme, rations, POL, and defence stores. Also when possible, a field kitchen that also looks after Bn Tac. All supplies come through "F" Echelon.	Trace "Y" Appx 21
