Immediately after C Coy were established on "O" by 0930 hours the CO and IO went up to their positions. Supporting arms, Artillery, 4.2 Mortars and 81 MM Mortars were excellent in getting C Coy onto the objective. There was no hitch in communications.</p> <p>C Coy casualties were one (1) killed and five (5) wounded, which included Lieut J McAuly a platoon commander. H hour for the operation was delayed one hour due to the Right flank not being secured, 1 KSLI on codesign 'L' MR163174, point 210, and 1 KOSB on Point 355, MR1718 codesign 'W' and also known as "BARLOW".</p> <p>By 1100 hours the Right flank objectives being secured by battalions of the 28 Bde, artillery and mortar fire plan put into operation as per fire plan.</p> <p>At 1105 hours D Coy and A Coy proceeded to advance. By 1330 hours D Coy was 300 yards minus 'M' and came under enemy small arms and mortar fire. The Mortar Platoon (81MM), and F Echelon also moved, with F Ech and Rice burners moving into the village of SANJOM-NI MR148171.</p> <p>Engineers with bulldozer are working hard on building the new road over the ridge at MR152164 which is skyline and visible to the enemy for miles from the West.</p> <p>Before Bn Tac could get dug in and settled they were subjected to enemy shelling, with the closest shells landing 25-30 yards from Tac CP</p> <p>It was felt that enemy artillery could only hit our small draw by accident. Enemy guns also ranged in on the skyline road hitting a mortar half track and one engineer 3/4 ton truck. Mortars had one killed and 2 wounded with the engineers having one killed (Korean rice-burner) and one wounded.</p> <p>The enemy fire also wounded two rice-burners on their way back from carrying rations to D Coy.</p> <p>At 0230 hours an enemy patrol attempted to infiltrate our lines and was fired upon by B Coy with small arms and 75 MM recoilless rifles. Four enemy were killed and the patrol dispersed. B Coy suffered one casualty (wounded), caused by the firing of the 75MM.</p>

During this action the Battalion's A/Tk Pl had their first opportunity to fire the 75 MM recoilless rifles at night against the enemy. Four enemy counted dead from fire of this weapon with one of the gun crew injured by back blast. In the wiring party's with drawal Cpl Tool missing, being the first man listed as missing in action in this battalion.
