All C.E.F. pensioners should at once natify the Canadian Ponsion Commission, Duly Building, Ottawa, which of the following provedures they wish to adopt:-
    - Pay the pension into a Trust Fund at Head Office (a) where it will draw interest at the current bakk rates and be availabe at any time to the pensioner on his request.
    - Pay the pension to the pensioners wife, or (b) dependent parents, or in the case of orpan children to some person nominated by the pensioner and appreved by the Commission who is caring for the chlidren, or.
    - Forward the pension cheque to the pensioner at (c) his address with the C.A.S.F., Unit.
- In advising the Pension Commission, pensioner must give his Regimental Number and Unit in the C.A.S.F. Powers of Attorney, or assignments of pension cannot be accepted by the commission.

- 1. Routine Order No. 67 is hereby amended as follows:Paras. 2 and 3 are cancelled and the following is substituted therefor:-
- 2. (a) Full dress and mess dress will not be worn on any occasion. Undress may be worn by all ranks in the evening when not on duty. This dress will be optional and officers and other ranks not in possession of it will not be required to provide it if they do not desire to do so.
  - (b) Undress will not be worn during the day on any occasion. Officers proceeding out of barracks or camps in this dress will wear the Sam Browne belt, without brace or frog, or a cloth belt of the same material and colour as the frock, and of the same pattern as authorized for the service dress jacket in para. 5 below, as amended by R.O. 79. Officers of Rifle regiments may alternatively wear the black patent leather shoulder belt with pouch. In Highland and Scottish regiments, variation in the articles of undress may be made according to regimental custom, e.g., dirk belt in place of the Sam Browne or cloth belt.
  - (c) Other ranks will not wear belts with undress.
  - (d) The wearing of collar badges with the undress serge frock is optional by units and commanding officers will be responsible for the maintenance of uniformity in this respect within their units.

Shoulder titles will not be worn with the undress serge frock.

(i) For details of Undress Order for officers see K.R. Can. para. 1297(9). Officers of regiments and corps for which a regimental or corps pattern coloured field service cap has been authorized may wear such cap in place of the undress forage cap. All officers, when not on duty, may also wear the coloured field service cap as authorized for their regiment or corps, with service dress, battle dress and khaki dregiments or Corps for which a coloured field service cap has not yet been authorized should submit particulars of the pattern of cap they desire to adopt, in accordance with the provisions of Appendix to this Routine Order. In Scottish kilter and trewed regiments, the Glengarry of authorized regimental pattern and in tank regiments the beret with regimental flash are worn in Undress Order.

(ii) As the undress serge frock will not be worn on any occasion when on duty, permission is granted for a white shirt with soft cuffs, a soft white collar and black tie fastened in a sailor's knot to be worn with the undress serge frock of the low step collar pattern.

Officers purchasing undress serge frocks will provide themselves with the pattern at present authorized which has a standup collar, except for the Canadian Chaplain Service in which the serge frock is of the same pattern as the service dress jacket.

- (f) Details of Undress Order for Warrant Officers N.C.Os. and men are set forth in Appendix II to this Routine Order. Attention is directed to the fact that the coloured field service cap has not yet been authorized to be worn by W.Os. N.C.Os. and men, in Canada. The matter is under consideration but until the necessary authority is published in Routine Orders, the headdress described in Appendix II to this Routine Order will continue to be worn in Undress Order by all W.Os., N.C.Os. and men. Other ranks not now in possession of Undress uniform, who may wish to provide themselves with it, are advised to defer purchase until the question of headdress is settled.
- (g) Except as otherwise provided above, service dress or battle dress, including khaki drill within the prescribed period, will be worn by all ranks except that officers on leave may be permitted to wear plain clothes and all ranks at their stations may also be permitted to wear plain clothes for the purpose of taking part in athletic exercises for which a special dres is necessary.
- 3. The wearing of orders, decorations and medals will cease. The ribbands of orders, decorations and medals will continue to be worn in undress, service dress and battle dress in the prescribed manner. (Effective 15th. May, 1940.)

# APPENDIX I TO ROUTINE ORDER No. 516

- Description of the Coloured Field Service Cap as Authorized for Officers of the Active Militia and Canadian Active Service Force:
- 1. The coloured field service cap is similar in shape to the Glengarry, about 4½ inches high and 3½ inches across the top; a folding peak at the front and flaps at the side to let down, which are fastened at the front with two small buttons when folded.

- 3. For officers of regiments and corps, including substantive Colonels belonging to a regiment or corps, the colour of the body, flaps, crown and piping will be as decided by the officer commanding the regiment or corps concerned, subject to approval in each case by National Defence Head-quarters. Badges and buttons will be of the authorized regimental pattern. In cases where a regimental button has not been adopted, the General Service button will be worn. Piping may be worn on the top of the cap and on the flaps and front and back seams, or in any one or more of these positions as may be decided by the regiment or corps concerned.
- 4. Officers Commanding regiments or corps which have not yet adopted the coloured field service cap and now desire to do so, should apply to the District Officer Commanding and include in their application the following information:

(a) Colour of body of cap.
(b) Colour of flap.
(c) Colour of crown.
(d) Colour of piping.

(e) Is there to be piping on top of cap.
(f) Is there to be piping on flaps.
(g) Is there to be piping on front and back seams.

Undress uniform is not stocked by, or supplied through Ordnance Depots and provision of such uniform by other ranks is entirely optional. It is to be distinctly understood that no soldier is to be required to provide himself with undress uniform and that, during the period of the war, it may be worn only in the evening, when not on duty.

- 2. Undress uniform now in possession of W.O.s., N.C.O.s. and men may be continued in wear until worn out but all replacements and all articles of undress uniform purchased in future will be of the authorized pattern for the regiment or corps concerned.
- 3. JACKET Patrol shape, no openings at bottom of side seams and unlined. In Highland and Scottish regiments, the skirts of the jacket will be rounded off in front for wear with kilts or trews.

MATERIAL - Blue serge, except rifle regiments, dark green serge.

COLLAR - Stand collar,  $1\frac{3}{4}$  in. deep, square at front, fastened with two hooks and eyes, lined with black Italian cloth, and fitted with cloth tab. Collar badges of regimental pattern may be worn at the discretion of the regiment or corps concerned.

POCKETS - (a) Breast pockets. -- Flap 3 in. deep and centre pointed, 1 in. plait at centre; top of flap in line with second button from collar, 7 in. deep from top of flap, 6 in. wide.

(b) Hip pockets.—Flap  $3\frac{1}{4}$  in. deep and centre pointed, no plait at centre, top of flap 1 in. below bottom button,  $8\frac{1}{2}$  in. deep from top of flap,  $8\frac{1}{4}$ —in. wide at top of flap, graduating to  $8\frac{3}{4}$ —in. at bottom of pocket.

SLEEVES - Pointed cuffs,  $5\frac{3}{4}$ -in. deep at top part,  $2\frac{3}{4}$ -in. deep at sides and underhalf.

SHOULDER STRAPS - Of the same material as the jacket sewn in the sleeve seam and fastened with a small G.S. or regimental button. Corps or regimental shoulder titles will not be worn.

BUTTONS - G.S. small size or regimental pattern, five at front and one for each pocket and shoulder strap.

4. TROUSERS & OVERALLS - Of the regimental pattern and of the same material as the jacket. In the case of mounted units either trousers or overalls may be worn, but there must be uniformity in the unit.

### 7. INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ECONOMIC CONTROL OF RATIONS:

Routine Order 151. The following points are to be brought to the attention of all concerned and steps are to be taken to see that frequent inspections are made and that wasto is climinated.

SUPPLY OF FOCD.

The rations approved for the C.A.S.F., with their alternatives, furnish a well-blanced dict with a high caloric value.

It is ospential that all nutritive components of this diet should be conservod and made available to the troops.

Constant case must be taken, on the receipt of food supplies from contractors that they are fully up to the standard laid down bothas to quality and quantity. Received in good condition, storage facilities for their protection until issued to troops, mut be adequate and steps must be taken to see that articles of

a perishable nature as not remain in storage too long.

PREPARATION OF FOOD. All food issued to troops has nutritive value, and troops must be trained to utilize all partiens of the same. Theurough training of cooks is essential in order that food should not only be properly cooked, but tastefully served. Weelly diet should be propared at least a week in advance in order that a varied diet may be provided. Diet sheets of Units should be forwarded to District Headquaters for approbal. icant inved;

PPEPARATION OF FOCD.
The following points will be found to require constant supervision —

(1) All benes should be placed in the soup caldrons to extract the nutritional value contained therin before being discarded.

(2) All scrapsof meat not found fit for roasting, frying, or boiling, should be so used, or made into sausages, stews, hash, or shepherd's pie, etc.

- (3) The outside leaves of cabbages and the skins of certain vegatagles are of considerable nutritional value. They should be washed and placed in the soup caldrons. It should be possible in this way to serve men with strong het soups very frequently. Het sours should be made available to troops comming off guard or night
- (4) Potatoes:- The portion of the potato. .containing the highest nutritive valuo that directly beneath the skin and is removed by pecling. It will be found that where petatoos are boding pealed they are frequently reduced in weight by nearly one third. Potatoes should, therefore, not be peeled but should be thouroughly cleansed, and the brown outer skin removed with wire brushes or potato cleaning equipment, if available,
- (5) Bread: should be cut and served to the men in quite small pieces not larger than one half of a throe-quarter inch slice, and the men should be informed that they may out us may of those pieces as they desire, but every piece taken must be cuter. Stale broad should be utilized for toust, puddings, sausages, etc.
- (6) M-at:- In the majority of military kitchens, meat is over cooked and its nutritive value partially destroyed. Many of our men do not like rare meat. A happy medium should be required. Not only should the kinds of meat used be veried, but the forms in which it is cooked and served should be constantly changed. A lerge quantity of meat scraps can be utilized in soups, sausages, rissoles, etc. (7) Fats:- All fats should be preserved. Many men eat little of no fat, but it will be noted that eating of fat increases in cold weather. All dripping must be preserved and utilized freely for cooking. Excess of fats should be disposed of to the trade, none should be at any time be dumped. All greases from kitchen should be set on one side for this purpose. In time of war, fats are required for the Laking of explosives, soaps, glycerine, etc. All kitchens should have grease
- traps which should be skimmed daily and the grease separately stored for disposal. Fish: -is a vory valuable alternative and should be served at least once a (8) week. Scraps of cold fish can be made up with potatoes, etc., and served as riss-oles. Cannod fish has practicly the same nutritive value as fresh fish but requires
- careful preparation in order to be palatable. (9) Fresh fruits and vegatables:- These articles have a special nutritive value when eated raw. There use in salads is strongly recommended. The root vegatables, Suchh as carrots, turnips, beets, parsnips, etc., have a definite value from the health standpoint and should be freely used. They should soldem be peeled. (10) Milk: - Fruporated or powdered milk retains most of the nutritive values. It is sterlized and protected from comtamination. Frosh milk if served to the troops

must always be pusturized to prevent infaction by various types of disease germs.

COOKING OF FOOD.

It is necessary that all cooks should be trained in the principles of dietetics and in the proper cooking and serving of food, and specially intelligent men should be selected for training in order that every Company should have at least four or five men always available. This will be of particular importance overseas. Before proceeding over seas, instruction should be given in field cookery. Our troops are found of pies, pastry, and puddings. Special training in this regardthe satisfaction of the troops. The head cook should be held responsible for all waste.

SERVING OF FOOD.

Men varyvery widely in the types of food that they prefer. Some are heavy meat eaters and small starch comsumers and visa versa. For this reason the cafeteria system of handing food to men from counter is generally wasteful and men do not cotain exactly what they desire. Men should be seated in groups of ten or twelve, the meat, vegetalbe, petatoes, bread, etc., should be placed on the table and the men permitted to help themselves. Sufficient Orderlies should provided to ensure that articles are served hot and removed when no longer required. Men should be trained to take only what they desire to eat and should not be permitted to leave the table without sating all they have helped themselves to. This practice will rapidly reduce waste.

This Officer should also look into the collection and disposal of grease. Cana should never be placed in the garbage; they should be insinerated. Thinneddition to the above, careful watch should be kept on the consumption of fuel for ccoking purposes.

SANITARY PRECAUTIONS.

Not only must kitchen floors, tables and culinary vessels be kept scrupulously classes. and sinks and sowers in proper condition, but the personnel employed must have clean hands and clean clothing. No man suffering from colds or infectious conditions should ? employed.

Every kitchen should have the means of sterlizing by boiling all table flat-ware,

cups, mugs, etc. after use, when infectious descases are present in the Unit.

Food must be protected from infection by flies.

R. O. 249. INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ECOMIC CONTROL OF RATIONS, ETC.

With reference to the instructions contained in C.A.S.F. Routine Order No.151, it is brought to the attention of all concerned that, all though there is a daily ration of commodities and quantities authorized; units. When indenting, are to take into consider ation the quantity of food stuffs on hand and will requisition for only such commodities in quantities which will actually be required for the day on which the rations are to be consumed. The over-stocking of food stuffs in small units; stores, with the consequent possibility of wastage, is to be guarded against at all times.

R.O.636. ECONOMY IN THE USE OF RATIONS AND CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL - SALVAGE OF NECESSARY WASTE.

In view of the fact that allegations are being constantly received at N.D.H.Q. to the effect that there is extravagance and waste in the operations of this Department, in respect of both the feeding of the troops and the construction of accommodation, it is again to be impressed on all concerned that the utmost effort is to be made to ensure the highest possible degree of officiency and economy in the use of both foodstuffs and construction materials. It is to be impressed on all runks that avoidable waste not only adds to the already huge cost of prosecuting the war, but also creates an unfavorably impression amongst the general public. It is to be borne in mind that what may appear to be a very trifling matter at the time, such as, for example, the discarding to garbage of a single loaf of bread, may easily develope into a an allegation through civilian sources that there is wholosale wastage of bread in the Army. In the same way, a visitor to one of our camps, seeing some rusty nails on the ground, spreads the report that there is terrific waste of building material, and so

4. OFFICERS & OTHER RANKS FORBIDDEN TO CORRESPOND

WITH STRANGERS: R.O.#639 The provisions of Routine Order No.387 of 1940 are republished and will be brought to the attention of all ranks:-

- 1. It has been brought to attention that offers or requests to correspond with soldiers are frequently made through the press and otherwise.
- 2. While many of the offers and requests may be bona fide, it is pointed out that such correspondence might provide a means for obtaining military information of value to the enemy, or of instituting enemy propaganda.
- 3. Accordingly, officers and other ranks are forbidden:
- (a) To insert advertisements or letters in any publication inviting strangers to communicate with them;

(b) To enter into correspondence with strangers in response

to advertisements or other invitations;

(c) In any other way to communicate with strangers by letter or otherwise concerning anything of a military nature.
